Acre, Israel

Program Description:

This program will offer students the opportunity to study in the Old City of Acre, Israel and earn 12 - 15 hours of credit through the College of Charleston. As a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Acre is a historic walled port-city. The remains of the Crusader town, dating from 1104 to 1291, lie almost intact, both above and below today's street level, providing an exceptional picture of the layout and structures of the capital of the medieval Crusader kingdom.

Classes are held at the Israel Antiquities Authority International Conservation Center-Citta di Roma, in partnership with the Saving the Stones practical conservation-training program. Students will have hands-on opportunity to work with the historic buildings of the old city.

This program is designed for majors or minors of Historic Preservation & Community Planning, Art & Architectural History, Archaeology, Jewish Studies, and International Studies, though majors, such as Religious Studies, History, Anthropology, and Urban Studies may also find this to be an invaluable experience. Students must have an overall GPA of 2.5 to participate.

The program will take place from March– May 2017, with the option of extending into early August 2017 for an Internship/Independent Study for credit with the Israel Antiquities Authority.
